Home of the Rush Wray Museum of Yancey County History Event Schedule 2000

Museum Hours: Wednesday's 10AM - 5PM & Saturday's 1 - 5 PM. April 29th - September 30th.

April 29th and 30th

The "Living Historians" from the 58th North Carolina Troops Preservation Society will set up both a Campaign and Winter Quarters style camp for the weekend. Demonstrations will include; troop drills, weapons, flags, life on the battle front as well as the home front, and fireside songs and talks. Exhibits, in the McElroy House, will include; the Home Guard headquarters and mapping office, and an extensive collection of Civil War era guns, clothing and artifacts. The event will conclude with a field Church Service on Sunday. Admission is \$3.00, with \$2.00 for each additional family or group member. Children under age 10 are free.

May 27th

New Local Displays and Exhibitions will be the highlight of the month. The featured exhibit will be "Thomas Wolfe and his Yancey County Connection" This extensively researched exhibit is being provided by Perry Dean Young who has also furnished the "Frankie Silvers" exhibit that has attracted so much attention. The local displays will include collections provided by area collectors who are providing a private view of Yancey County.

June 24th

The traditional music of Red Wilson, on fiddle, Bruce Greene, on banjo, and Rob Levin, on guitar will delight Museum patrons with mountain songs and stories. Matching funds for this event comes from a Grass Roots Grant provided through the Toe River Arts Council. Admission is \$3.00.

July 29th

The opening of on loan Exhibitions and Displays will begin and run for one month. The History Association is currently working with other regional Museums to secure, on temporary loan, Exhibits of Regional importance and Displays of articles and artifacts that have left Yancey County.

August 26th

Traditional Food & Craft Demonstrations ranging from apple butter and honey to wheel thrown pottery and candle making will fill the McElroy House and grounds.

September 28th - 30th

" A FINAL FAREWELL & FOND FAREWELL " The first One Act Play, set in May of 1865, finds John Wesley McElroy preparing to make his final departure from the home that he built in the early 1840's. The second One Act Play will Follow an intermission. William Martin Moore's character will come to life sharing the story of his colorful life on the last day he spent in the house May 1899. Friday and Saturday performances at 8:00 pm and Sunday at 2:00 pm. Admission is \$5.00.
