Every Sunday afternoon in June and August brought music lovers – both performers and listeners – together for a couple of hours of old time music, folk and regional standards, some original tunes, and some truly unforgettable performances by some of the area’s finest musicians. Old and young alike came to perform and freely share their talents. Our thanks to Ron and Minnie Powell, who coordinated the performances and brought their sound equipment every Sunday afternoon; and to David Wiseman, who was always there to perform and to lead the “Jammin in the Shade” underneath the big oak tree on the other side of the McElroy House. We plan on returning the first Sunday in June next year, and look forward to an even bigger and better event.

STUART WILSON PAINTING

It’s a real honor to have my painting in the museum. As you know, it’s of Lieutenant Wilson Adkins, who served in Company G, 29th NC Infantry. He was my great-great grandfather.

My mother is Mrs. Nelda Peterson Wilson. Her parents were Augustus Raymond “Guss” Peterson (1895-1992) and Ida Adkins (1901-1980). Ida Adkins was born in Ramseytown and was the daughter of Christopher Columbus “Kit” Adkins (1867-1961) and Martha Ella Cooper (1872-1958). Her grandfather, the father of Kit Adkins, was Lieutenant Wilson Adkins.

Wilson Adkins was born in Ramseytown on August 27, 1836. He was the son of Rickles N. Adkins and Debby Bryant. He married Cecelia Honeycutt on March 9, 1856. He volunteered for service in Company G of the 29th NC Infantry with his brother David and two cousins on July 26, 1861. He caught a fever

while on leave in Ramseytown during the war and did not return to service. After the war, he served as a Justice of the Peace but did not live very long. He died of tuberculosis on July 11, 1878 at the age of 41.



OLD TIMEY FALL FESTIVAL 2015

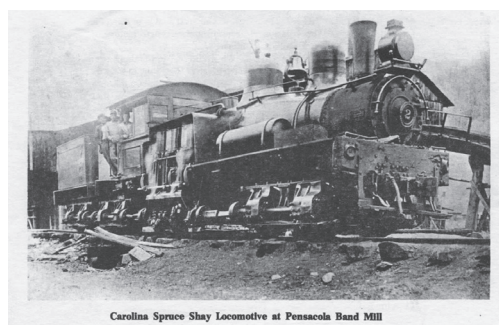

SALUTE TO BOB WILSON



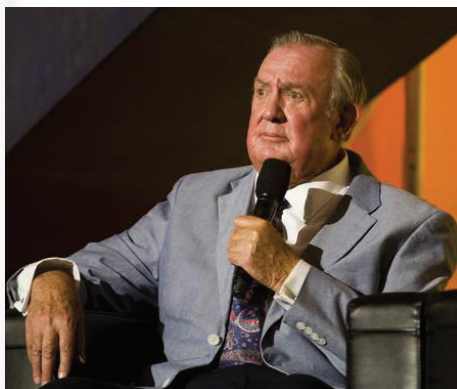
