

Preserving Our Appalachian Heritage

Late Summer/Fall 2011

In Branson's Directory of 1868, Dr. O.M. Lewis was mentioned as a physician in the Burnsville area along with William Horton, Thomas Houston and B.B. Whittington. In the next issues of the newsletter, Betty T. Parker will be highlighting early physicians in the county. Beginning with the materials featured in Toe River Valley History, Vol. I, edited by Lloyd Bailey. Dr. Lewis' family tree is as follows:

William Jones Lewis (1792-1853) born in what was Buncombe Co, near what is now Hendersonville. He moved to what would become Yancey around 1826, possibly in anticipation of the county's formation, and established himself as a merchant. He then married Celia Wilson around 1829. He was noted as a, "very generous man, free hearted and liberal towards his friends. He endorsed notes for his friends to large amounts and had them to pay, which finally broke him up in his old age."

He served as Deputy Clerk as early as 1837, for which a bond of \$10,000.00 was reguired, and also as Justice of the Peace (Magistrate) in 1842.

Celia Wilson, his wife, is mentioned in the Yancey County will of her father, Edward Wilson, an early settler of Yancey County. He left her a negro girl named Jane. He mentions Celia's children as Rufus, Oscar, Louisa Woodfin and Mary.

Descendants of W. J. Lewis, in Yancey County have stated that they are descended from Col. Fielding Lewis who married the sister of George Washington. The evidence above does not support this claim. They were, instead, 3rd cousins once removed. (For further genealogy of the family, see article 470 in the TRVH, Vol. I.)

What we do know is that William J. and

wife Cecelia had the following children: (1) Rufus Henry, b. 1830 (2) Louisa Morning, b. 1832, m. John Woodfin, (3) Oscar Marville .. (4) Marv Eliza, m. S.S. Grant in Yancey County in 1865.

Dr. O.M. Lewis was b. 12/25/1833 and died 10/21/1903. He was a physician, and served as a Confederate Surgeon. His hobby was photography. He married Frances Rhea, b. 11/21/1838 - 7/22/1903. Oscar M. is buried in Burnsville Academy Hill Cemetery

The doctor and his wife were the parents of: (1) William D., (2) Mary Cecelia (m. John M Lyon of Texas). John Lyon was an early newspaper publisher in Burnsville. (3) Harriett Elizabeth, m. Riley Proffit. (4) Ida Louise (5) Oscar Reah "Oss", newspaper publisher in Burnsville, (6) Dora L., m. George Anglin, buried in Academy Hill Cemetery in Burnsville. (7) Georgeanna G. and (8) Charles Grant who, unfortunately died as an infant by falling of the porch and drowning in a horse trough.




